LOCATION: All workshops will be held in the Competition Arena at Argus Ranch, 35612 212th Way SE, Auburn, WA 98092.

COST FOR CAMP: \$225/day OR \$600 all 3 days; Due at the time of registration, does not include lodging.

She currently has outreach teaching programs at Morgan Hill Dog Sports in San Martin, CA; ACE Dog Sports in San Francisco and the Sports Dog Center in Santa Rosa, CA. Moe has taught at Power Paws Summer and Winter Camps as well as Clean Run Instructor Camps. She has written for Clean Run Magazine and currently travels throughout North America teaching agility workshops and seminars. She is the author of the best selling DVD "The Road to a Perfect Partnership, Foundation Training for Agility". Moe coaches teams ranging from Rhodesian Ridgebacks to Shibu Inus to Airedales to all Americans. Moe teaches all levels of agility..

Moe is extremely well known for her ability to handle her dogs through challenging courses at a distance! Join us to learn how to handle distance from one of the best!

Descriptions of Sessions -

Awesome Blind Crosses - Holy Blind Crosses, Batman! This workshop is all about the blind. We will do blind cross proofing exercises to build trust and commitment into your blind crosses. Then we will put those blinds to the test by putting them in short sequences and courses so both you and your dog can learn how to master the blind cross! This workshop is appropriate for dogs novice to masters level and want to improve your blind cross commitment and understanding. (Due to scheduling conflicts Batman will not be able to attend this workshop). This is appropriate for dogs of all levels.

Young Dog Skill Building - Workshop with the young dog in mind! Tammy will walk you through challenges that will test your young dogs understanding of their training giving you an idea of what skills can be built up and what skills are looking good!

Discriminations - Does your dog understand their discriminations with you ahead? In the workshop we will break discriminations down so that both you and your dog understand them from anywhere! We will focus on cuing the obstacle and leaving so you can get anywhere on course! This workshop is appropriate for dogs novice to masters level and want to improve your serpentine commitment and understanding.

Connection - This workshop will challenge you and your dog's connection on course. Providing off course opportunities, challenging lines and situations that test your skills as a team, you will learn how to stay connected throughout the course. This workshop is for those teams that are sequencing jumps and tunnels.

Weaves - Weaves are one of the most challenging pieces of equipment to train and PROOF. Learn how to proof your weaves to the max! There will be weave discrimination drills, entry exercises and proofing exercise so you and your dog will have the weaves mastered!

Building Confidence for Motivation & Speed - Want to improve your dog's course times? Does your dog struggle with lack of motivation? Come join Tammy Moody for a workshop targeting building speed, confidence & motivation! This class is created for those who have dogs that may be lacking the motivation to play, train, or run with their handlers.

Decel For Collection & Tight Turns - Ever wonder how you can help your dog understand tight turns better? Your motion plays a HUGE role in your dogs understanding of collection and extension. Learn how to use your motion to create beautiful tight turns with your dog headed in the right direction next!

Building Blocks For Distance - We will be training the foundation for using distance; this starts one obstacle at a time. Single obstacle training for distance – lateral distance and forward sends. Build your dog's confidence with these skill building exercises so you will be ready to sequence at a distance later with clarity.

How to Handle Discriminations with Distance - Verbals increase your dog's confidence and speed when your body language is conflicting or nonexistent you aren't in the picture! Verbals are perfect for handlers who are less mobile or for tricky parts of a course when you need to operate at a distance from your teammates.

The Art Of Send & Go - How far can you send?? - Have you ever wondered how some people seem to just always be able to get ahead of their dog? It is because they can send and LEAVE! We will focus on training and building understanding of commitment to obstacles so you can get ahead. For teams sequencing jumps and tunnels.

How to Handle With Distance - Sequences to work on finding the shortest most efficient path for handler while allowing the dog to do the "heavy lifting". Dogs need to have some basic understanding of distance skills and some verbals.

Putting It All Together - Working Skills In Courses - In this session we will focus on short challenging sequences that will test both you and your dog on the agility field. Learn the best handling for your dog while still proofing their understanding of sends, masters coursework, blind crosses, front crosses, and more!
